PILLOWCASE INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric:

- 100% good quality child friendly (bright/bold/whimsical/novelty print) cotton fabric
- Wash in fragrant free detergent / dryer sheets prior to sewing; white distilled vinegar is a good substitute for expensive detergent.
- Use Color Catchers to check for bleeding.

Required Fabric:

- Body 3/4 yard
- Cuff 1/3 yard

Cut pieces as follows:

- Body 26" x WOF
- Cuff 11" x WOF

1. Lay Cuff (11" piece) fabric *right* side up on the work surface.
2. Lay Body (26" piece) fabric *right* side up on top of Cuff fabric. Line up raw edges at top. Pin.
3. Roll the Body fabric up from the bottom. Bring the bottom edge of the Cuff fabric up to top edge of all fabric, matching and pinning all layers. Be careful not to catch Body fabric in seam except for top raw edge.
4. Stitch 3/8 to 1/2-inch seam along pinned edge. Important to be accurate with seam width. You now have a tube of fabric. Turn the tube inside out.
5. Press along Cuff edge. Make sure Cuff fabric is smooth and pressed.
6. Trim raw edges (selvages) along long side and bottom.
7. Finish seams with:
 - a. Serger. Lock seams at end. Be sure stitches are tight. Match *right* sides together and pin so Cuff is aligned.
 - b. French Seam: Match *wrong* sides together and pin so Cuff is aligned. Sew scant 1/4-inch seam along side and bottom. Turn (right sides together), press, sew 3/8 to 1/2-inch seam alongside and bottom.
8. Congratulations! You now have a finished pillowcase.

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GUIDELINES AND TIPS

- No raw edges. Seams must be serged or use the French seam method.
- All fabric should be washed prior to sewing.
- It is important that the top edge of the Cuff line up.
- No paint or glitter that could flake off.
- Do not piece the Body or Cuff fabric.
- Please do not use black or dark solid colored fabric for the Body. Black / dark solid fabric are not fun colors for kids.
- Do not combine flannel and cotton. The fabric shrinks at different rates. Same with polyester fabric and cotton; fabrics shrink differently (or not at all in the case of polyester).
- Flannel is acceptable. Roll the edge over like a hem finish.
- Please don't use rough / stiff fabric; fabric that is not soft to the touch.
- No need to add a trim piece.
- When sewing along Body edges, sew off the end. Don't turn to sew along end edge.
- Iron as you go along. Makes for a quality finished product.
- Wash completed pillowcase and place in a quart size zip lock baggie. If you do not have quart size zip lock bags, not to worry. Place the laundered pillowcases in a gallon zip lock for transport.
- Fabric / completed pillowcase may be washed in white distilled vinegar vs expensive detergent.
- Please don't use damaged fabric or fabric that smells.
- Please no microfiber.
- Please no panels.
- Please do not use outdated fabric.
