TIPS AND TECHNIQUES **CUTTING MAT CARE**

Cutting mats are expensive and believe it or not, they need regular cleaning to prolong their life. The mat swallows and absorbs tiny pieces of fabric which can easily be removed using an eraser. There are some made just for cutting mats, but really any eraser will do.

The number one thing that ruins a mat faster is using a dull blade. Make sure you always have a sharp blade.

After removing fuzz and fabrics using the eraser, use a light spray over your mat. Use one drop of Dawn liquid soap (or other mild soap) and using a kitchen scrubber, gently scrub in a circular motion. Wipe off using a damp towel. Use another towel and tepid water to "rinse off" any excess soap.

Let dry. Excess moisture isn't going to harm the mat. In fact, there's one male quilter I follow who lightly spritzes water on his mat when he's done for the day.
