SEWING RETREAT


It's that time of year again! No, not the holidays. It's retreat time!



Several had asked for directions to Hollywood Garbage, the card game we played. See the instructions below .

Hollywood Garbage Phases

1 - Poker

Each player antes 5 nickels in the center of the table.

Dealer deals 5 cards in rotation to each player, face up

Whoever has the best poker hand wins the nickels

(Poker hands: 1 pair, 2 pair, 3 of a kind, Straight, etc.)

2 - Bingo

Players keep their cards

Dealer calls cards in her hand, players cover their cards

Whoever gets all cards covered wins everyone's nickels

3 - Put and Take

Dealer does not play, players keep their 5 cards

Dealer turns up 1 card; if a player has it, they put a nickel in the pot

On the second card, put in 2 nickels, 3 cards-3 nickels, up to 10

Dealer turns up 1 card, players take back 1, 2, 3, up to 10.

Any shortage is covered by the dealer

4 - Birthday



Dealer only plays, turns up card 1, 2, 3 up to K.

If the face of the card matches the call, players pay the dealer

If the dealer is on card 6 and a 6 is turned up, all players pay the dealer 6 nickels

Pass shuffled cards to the next player to deal

Continue until everyone has dealt
